


**FIGURE 1** Location of the six main dams in the WCWSS. The largest dam, Theewaterskloof, is located outside the main catchment and supplies water to WCWSS through an inter-basin transfer. (Reprinted with permission from Atkins et al. (Submitted), Copyright 2019 Ffion Atkins)

# Mayor De Lille's Remarks on Day Zero January 18, 2018

“We have reached a point of no return. Despite our urging for months, 60 percent of Capetonians are callously using more than 87 litres per day. It is quite unbelievable that a majority of people do not seem to care and are sending all of us headlong towards Day Zero.

At this point we must assume that they will not change their behaviour and that the chance of reaching Day Zero on 21 April 2018 is now very likely.”
