## *Securing a Grass-Mowing Contract in Stockton, CA*

### *Epilogue*

The contract with Al Fresco proceeded as negotiated in October 2018. In July 2019, City Manager Kurt Wilson was fired in the middle of his contract by a unanimous 6-0 vote by Mayor Tubbs and the city council.<sup>1</sup> There were multiple reasons for the decision.

“Being cautious fiscally makes a lot of sense,” Tubbs said at a meeting in June 2019, one month before Wilson left Stockton. “But is this budget the best we can do as far as getting some immediate gratification?”<sup>2</sup> City Councilmember Susan Lenz, who was absent from the vote, said afterwards: “I’m all for being healthy fiscally. But [right now] you drive around the City, and you see places where the same issues are there from when I got elected.”<sup>3</sup>

As he left Stockton, Wilson wrote the following in a farewell email: “Recent changes in priorities, direction, and vision for the city present new opportunities for the next city manager to cement his or her own legacy. Hopefully, the long-term financial perspective will retain its rightful place at the forefront of city policies and decisions.”<sup>4</sup>
